Questionnaire on implementation of the Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking in Persons, Especially Women and Children, supplementing the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime

The purpose of the present questionnaire is to collect information from States parties and signatories to the Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking in Persons, Especially Women and Children, supplementing the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime (General Assembly resolution 55/25, annex II), in accordance with guidance provided by the Conference of the Parties to the Convention at its first session and in the context of the programme of work approved at that session (decision 1/5). The information to be provided will relate to the following areas, as determined by the Conference of the Parties, for consideration at its second session:

- (a) Basic adaptation of national legislation in accordance with the Protocol;
- (b) Examination of criminalization legislation and difficulties encountered in implementation of article 5 of the Protocol;
- (c) Enhancing international cooperation and developing technical assistance to overcome difficulties identified in the implementation of the Protocol;
- (d) Views on and experience regarding the protection of victims and preventive measures, gained primarily in the implementation of articles 6 and 9 of the Protocol, including awareness-raising.¹
