RACE AND CULTURE IN MODERN JAPAN

This seminar will study Japanese conceptions of race, ethnicity, and culture from the late 19th century through the present with an emphasis on formations of conceptions of race and culture under the Japanese empire, as it expanded from the early twentieth century through the 1940s. We will focus on four historical problems: 1) the degree to which Western theories of racism, anti-semitism, and racism under colonialism can be applied to the Japanese case 2) the mobilization of an ideology of 'Uapaneseness' during the early modern and modern eras 3) the particularities of Japanese cultural essentialism as a racial theory and 4) historical articulations of cultural formulations of Japan's relationship to the West in relationship to state ideology.

This is primarily a reading and discussion seminar. Each week one or two students will give brief presentations on supplementary readings, but the emphasis will be on discussion of close reading of theoretical, secondary, and primary sources. Whenever possible students will be encouraged to read relevant texts in Japanese, Chinese, and Korean for purposes of presentation and discussion and for the ten-fifteen page analytical/historiographical paper which will be due during exam week.
