# Who Are These Laborers?

he Laborers are retired individuals who come from all walks of life. Those with experience help those with less experience. Christian prin-



ciples are applied on the construction site, and each worker does what he or she can. Laborers For Christ workers work for LCMS organizations to build the ministries' facilities.

Most Laborers have a recreational vehicle (RV) that they move to the work site for the duration of the project. If the

Laborer does not have an RV, the participating organization may be able to help locate housing.

Today, there are hundreds of Laborers on the official roster of the Laborers For Christ program. Some are part-time, working on one or two projects a year. Others are full-time, working in the northern part of the country during the summer and in the South during the winter.
