Laborers Leave Memories and More at Sheridan, Wyo.

aborers, working for Immanuel Lutheran Church in Sheridan, Wyo., have finished their construction on the new 5,200 sq. ft. fellowship hall addition. But Pastor William Heine hasn't forgotten them.

LFC workers traded lots of good-natured teasing with the pastor about the abundance of rabbits that populated the parsonage backyard where Laborers parked their RVs during their two-month stint. The Laborers left the pastor parting gifts (a puzzle, dish, coffee mug) decorated with—you guessed it—bunnies.

"I think it just typifies what I have seen in Laborers—people who are good-natured. They love what they're doing, and it shows," said Pastor Heine, who is no stranger to the LFC program. His father, Gilbert Heine, served 10 years as a Laborer and was an LFC Standing Committee member and LFC regional consultant before his death in 2002.

Immanuel's new fellowship hall—a first for the 104-year-old congregation—seats 130 people and includes a kitchen, offices, two restrooms, and storage space. For two decades, members talked about the need for such an addition, Pastor Heine says.

LCEF got the ball rolling by assisting the congregation with its vision, fund raising, and

a \$400,000-plus loan. Laborers, working for the congregation, framed the building, and installed windows, interior doors and siding.

Pastor Heine said he was impressed by the 14 Laborers, who did top-notch work and also "participated in the life of the church" by leading their own daily devotions, taking part in Bible classes, and worshiping with the congregation. Working with LCEF and the Laborers, he added, was "a nice, seamless way of getting this done."

Laborer Don Foth, project manager for the congregation, says Immanuel provided so many willing workers that the project moved along faster than others its size. Three to five volunteers pitched in every day, he said, providing an estimated 1,000 total hours of work over two months.

In a gesture of appreciation, one Laborer—who also is an Immanuel member—made a 4-by-9-ft. wooden cross that now hangs on the side of the new fellowship hall. Dedication of the building was scheduled for September 9.



Rain Delay in Andover, Kansas, Lends Helping Hand in Greensburg

rain delay that pushed back one construction project also gave Laborers For Christ, working for an Andover, Kan., congregation, the opportunity to help another nearby Lutheran church after a devastating tornado.

Two precipitation-filled months postponed the start of an 8,200 sq. ft. fellowship hall at Peace Lutheran Church, Andover. Although Laborers typically work for one congregation at a time, some of the workers for Peace, Andover, headed 120 miles west to Peace Lutheran Church, Greensburg. A May tornado destroyed that congregation's building and wiped out much of Greensburg.

Laborers, working for the congregation, helped erect a 14-by-54-ft. modular unit, supplied by Orphan Grain Train and LCMS World Relief and Human Care. Jim Young, project manager in Andover, was among those who trekked to Greensburg. The Laborers were happy to help "because those people (in Greensburg) need a place

to worship," he said.

Once the skies cleared in Andover, Laborers returned to Peace to work on the new fellowship hall that will include four classrooms, two offices, and a new entryway into the attached church building. The congregation currently uses a doublewide trailer for fellowship activities.

The expansion, which is expected to be completed in October, "is a visible symbol to the community that the church is growing, just as the community is growing," said Rev. Dean Von Stroh, Peace's pastor. A developer is building 2,000 homes across the street from the church, he said, and two nearby elementary schools recently opened.

"That's why we had to do this—to meet the demands of the community's growth," Von Stroh said. Only about a fifth of the congregation's 130 worshipers were members when Von Stroh began serving Peace six-and-a-half years ago. "The rest are new," said the pastor, who expects membership to continue climbing.

A \$500,000-plus loan from LCEF "made the project possible" by providing a much lower interest rate than what was available from commercial lenders, according to Von Stroh. "It's been a blessing," he said.
