Brown's win brings governor's office back to Democrats

Former Gov. Jerry Brown — defying both a crushing conservative wave sweeping the nation and a tsunami of spending by his billionaire opponent handily beat eBay CEO Meg Whitman Tuesday, a historic win that returns the 72-year-old Democrat to the post he held nearly three decades ago as California's chief executive.

Boxer turns back Fiorina's challenge, secures 4th term

In a race Republicans needed to win to take over the U.S. Senate, Democratic Sen. Barbara Boxer fought off a fierce challenge from former Hewlett-Packard CEO Carly Fiorina and defeated the Republican first-time office-seeker.

The battle drew national attention – and millions in independent expenditures from outside California — as Boxer was seen as vulnerable in a year where incumbency and loyalty to President Obama were considered liabilities.

Pelosi nears end of reign as voters vent their anger

WASHINGTON — Voters toppled House Speaker Nancy Pelosi from power Tuesday, four years after she became the first female speaker in history, handing the majority of the House of Representatives to Republicans in a landslide surpassing the historic election of 1994.

With polls closed but returns in the West still not tallied, Republicans had won 233 seats to the Democrats' 174. Republicans defeated 58 incumbent Democrats, a stunning blow to President
